# **Esau Sold His Birthright**

The letter to the Hebrew Christians is a plea for them to remain faithful to Christ. First, the writer charges them, Hebrews 2:1, 3 <sup>1</sup> "Therefore we ought to give the more earnest heed to the things which we have heard, lest at any time we should let *them* slip... <sup>3</sup> How shall we escape, if we neglect so great salvation; which at the first began to be spoken by the Lord, and was confirmed unto us by them that heard *him*; ..." Through neglect, it would be possible for the Hebrews to fall into condemnation.

Next, the author makes it clear that it is possible for a saved person to fall short of the prize. After reminding them of the Israelites who failed to enter into the promised rest in the land of Canaan, the writer charges Christians in Hebrews 4:11 – "Let us labour therefore to enter into that rest, lest any man fall after the same example of unbelief."

In Hebrews 10:26-27, they are reminded, <sup>26</sup>"For if we sin wilfully after that we have received the knowledge of the truth, there remaineth no more sacrifice for sins, <sup>27</sup>But a certain fearful looking for of judgment and fiery indignation, which shall devour the adversaries."

Remaining faithful to the Lord is next compared to finishing the race that we have begun. We are charged to lay aside sins that can weight us down, Hebrews 12:1-2a (KJV) Wherefore seeing we also are compassed about with so great a cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which doth so easily beset us, and let us run with patience the race that is set before us, Looking unto Jesus the author and finisher of our faith..."

There is danger that one may "fail of God's grace." The case of Esau is used as a warning to Christians. He had a birthright, as do we, in the Lord, Hebrews 12:14-17 (KJV) <sup>14</sup>Follow peace with all *men*, and holiness, without which no man shall see the Lord: <sup>15</sup>Looking diligently lest any man fail of the grace of God; lest any root of bitterness springing up trouble *you*, and thereby many be defiled; <sup>16</sup>Lest there *be* any fornicator, or profane person, as Esau, who for one morsel of meat sold his birthright. <sup>17</sup>For ye know how that afterward, when he would have inherited the blessing, he was rejected: for he found no place of repentance, though he sought it carefully with tears.

Esau chose the sensual over the spiritual. He gave in to the cravings of his hunger - Gen 25:29-34. He valued the red pottage (stew) more highly than his birthright. Today, Christians are heirs according to the promise made to Abraham - Galatians 3:29 (KJV) <sup>29</sup> "And if ye be Christ's, then are ye Abraham's seed, and heirs according to the promise." We are joint-heirs with Christ - Romans 8:16 - 17 (KJV) <sup>16</sup> "The Spirit itself beareth witness with our spirit, that we are the children of God: <sup>17</sup>And if children, then heirs; heirs of God, and joint-heirs with Christ; if so be that we suffer with him, that we may be also glorified together."

### Choose to "Do Well"

While watching a movie entitled An Old Fashioned Christmas on the Hallmark Channel, I scribbled down an outstanding observation a character made about choosing a path in this world.

In this movie, which is based on a story set in the 1880's by Louisa May Alcott, one young man took a house guest out to a pub and got him drunk. Later at the dinner table, with the entire family gathered around, his behavior was brought to light. The young instigator played the event off by saying, "It's all part of becoming a man!" His mother profoundly said, "It depends on what kind of man one wishes to become."

The lesson in this simple statement is powerful. What we become depends a lot upon the choices we make. As God told Cain in Gen. 4:7, "If you do well, will you not be accepted? And if you do not do well, sin lies at the door. Its desire is for you, but you should rule over it."

Cain didn't amount to much, because he didn't rule over his desire to sin. Like the young man in the movie, if we accept sin as a "rite of passage," we are quite literally choosing sin, and a path that leads away from God and toward destruction.

If you want to become the kind of person God wants you to be, choose to "do well." Refuse sin and live for Jesus!

## Christian, Be Quiet

I don't know that I have ever heard a sermon on the need for quiet. Yet, the Bible teaches that God will "quiet you by his love" (Zeph. 3:17). Peter lauds the need for a quiet spirit, which is very precious in God's sight" (1 Peter  $3\cdot4$ )

Habakkuk instructs all people "...the Lord is in his holy temple; let all the earth keep silence before him." (Hab. 2:20)

We need to stop talking so we can listen. We need to turn off the screens so we can meditate on God. We need to shut off the radio, CD player, iPod and turn down the noise of life so we can truly hear God's word.

Being quiet helps us to concentrate on what needs to change in our hearts, minds and lives. So often the voices of worldly passion, selfishness, lust, fear, hatred are present within us. We have skillfully ignored them so long that they blend in with noise of life. As Christians, we can silence those worldly callings as we put off the old man and put on the new

T.D. Chisholm penned these beautiful words that teach just what I'm trying to say:

Buried w ith Christ, my blessed Redeemer,
Dead to the old life of folly and sin;
Satan may call, the w orld may entreat me,
There is no voice that answ ers w ithin.
Dead to the w orld, to voices that call me,
Living anew, obedient but free;
Dead to the joys that once did enthrall me—
Y et 'tis not I. Christ liveth in me.

Quiet forces us to listen to our inner man as he calls us to reform our character. Many of us don't hear our own soul's cry to seek God's saving grace.

We've turned up the distraction volume knob to squelch the pains of guilt and remorse and the cry for repentance.

Why are we so afraid to hear the call of our own broken lives? Some try to drown out the quiet with booze or drugs. Some try to hush the Word of God from working on their conscience by filling every moment with some noisy distraction, foolishly thinking; "if I don't hear it I won't have to deal with it."

Habakkuk knew that focusing on the Holiness of the Lord takes a halting of everything else. That is why he calls for silence in God's temple. I wonder if we remember that we are God's temple. God should occupy the throne room of our hearts. This calls for our lives to be sober and reverent reflections of the Heavenly Host reigning in our hearts.

Another need for being quiet is that we should be more careful what we say. We really don't have to insert our opinion into every conversation. We don't need to try to say everything we think. In fact, we would be much better off if we were "quick to hear, slow to speak" (James 1:19).

Being quiet includes refraining from gossiping, slandering, bragging, boasting, vainly flattering, lying, swearing, cursing, talebearing, criticizing, speaking words of contention, course jesting, idle words, and euphemisms etc. Imagine how much quieter we would be if all this speech was removed from our conversations.


