# "A Tribute To A Good Friend and Faithful Elder-Tommy Bellomy"

Good candidates for the eldership aren't sitting on every pew in most congregations of the Lord's church. For the most part, the ones who desire this office realize that they must take very seriously the responsibility of the souls of an entire congregation over which they will serve as shepherds. To be a good elder there has to be a passion and compassion for people. The loss of a good elder is felt heavily in a church. The Broad Street congregation has suffered such a loss this week, and we feel it very heavily.

On Monday morning Brother Tommy Bellomy slipped silently into the sleep of death following a gradual but steady decline in his health over the past decade. He was not a complainer, and many did not know the weakened condition he was in during the last couple of years before his finally agreeing to move into Southern Estates Assisted Living. Until the Covid virus made it impossible for us to visit Tommy, he continued to receive his friends with great enthusiasm. He lived on this earth 98 and three quarters years and would have turned 99 in December. Paradise and Heaven awaited this man of God.

Many of our adults cannot remember a time when Brother Tommy was not an elder here. In fact, his service to this congregation reaches back to 1954 when he and Ralph Sheppard were installed as deacons. He served as a deacon for 16 years, and in 1970 was installed as an elder of the Broad Street congregation. He served in that role for 51 years -67 years of combined service to this congregation.

Tommy was a good elder. He loved people. Many members have commented of their ability to talk with him about spiritual or material problems. I watched him over our 19 plus years together. He listened attentively and often didn't speak until after giving serious deliberation to the matter at hand. When he spoke, it was with conviction, and worthy of our listening to him.

Not only was he a good leader in the church, but Tommy served his country with honor during World War II. He was a volunteer firefighter for many years, and Postmaster of Scottsboro for 35 years. His daughter, Jennifer Chandler, posted on the internet that "what gave him the most joy was serving his Lord and Savior and the Broad Street Church of Christ."

I've served under 34 men as elders in my 53 years of ministry. Twenty-three of them are now deceased. My heart is heavy as I think about these losses to local congregations where I ministered. My heart is heavy as I think about our loss of Bro. Tommy Bellomy. I will personally miss our frequent lunches when he was able, and being his travel partner to the Freed-Hardeman Lectures when his health permitted him to travel. Tommy was my friend as well as my elder.

Someone will arise and take the mantle. Until the Lord intervenes in His second coming, the church will go on. Thankfully, we will never be quite the same because Brother Tommy touched our hearts and had such a positive impact on our lives. He wasn't a perfect man, but he was so conscientious about doing right by the church and by the individual. Our love and best wishes are extended today to his family. May the God of all comforts bless us all.
