Mothers who live within our hearts but are no longer numbered among the living.

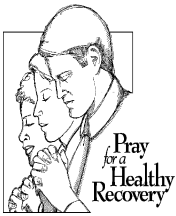
Can you still hear the voice of your mother in the many things that you do? We should, and God’s Word encourages us to keep those words very close to our hearts:



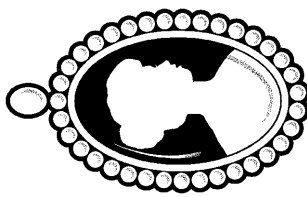
