



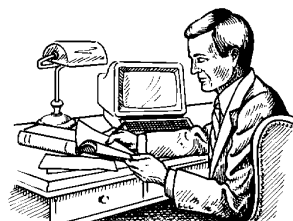

From Where I Sit . . .

Terry's Announcement On Sunday, May 22, 2022 Of Partial Retirement

If I live to see the date, September will mark 55 years that I have been preaching weekly, and at least two years before that just preaching by appointments whenever I had the opportunity. This coming November will mark 54 of those years in full-time ministry.

I asked the Elders to meet with me on Thursday, May 19, to share with them a decision that Kathy and I have arrived at. It's time for me to make an adjustment in my life and cut back to a partial retirement state. I have officially indicated to the Elders that they can begin their search for a new "full-time" minister to replace me. In the weeks or months ahead during that search, I will continue on here as your minister, and I will assist the Elders in searching out my replacement. Our meeting was very cordial and encouraging to me personally.

Kathy and I love our family at Broad Street and we have been richly blessed with the privilege of serving the Lord with this congregation for 20 years as of earlier this month of May. We have our home here, and we plan to continue living here for the present time. No one can know their future, and there could come a time when we need to move close to one of our children for health reasons. Meanwhile, this is home. Lord being willing, we will worship here with you after the new minister has moved here, and as our schedule allows. I will be accepting invitations to hold Gospel Meetings, interim preaching for churches that are in between ministers, and occasional appointments to speak at congregations within driving distance. Meanwhile, we hope to be included in your fellowships, and in your prayers.

This is a decision that was hard for me to arrive at, and hard on Kathy while I bounced back and forth these past months, all because we've loved our work and our many friends here. We haven't decided to quit serving the Lord, nor to quit helping this congregation as opportunities present themselves.

Pray for our Elders. They are good men and want what's best for this congregation. Their search may take quite some time. They have expressed the gravity of such a large task. Their plan is to be very thorough and not rush in making the selection. I assured them that I would continue in my work here as usual until that transition is completed successfully. Pray that God will send the right servant into the view of our Elders.

May God bless you all! He has so richly blessed Kathy and I. We've served 5 congregations in those 54 full-time years, and we pray daily for the good folks in all those congregations, thanking God for those who continuously encouraged us in our work. We want to be encouragers of this great congregation as well. We love each of you, and covet your prayers.

Outside vs Inside

What is more important, what we look like and what everyone thinks of us or who we are on the inside? Maybe a better way to say it, are we popular by the world's standards or are we Christians? Maybe you say, I'm both! And, I suppose that could and does happen, but who you are on the inside is always more important to GOD than what we look like or what everyone thinks of us. What media and society feeds us is made up of people's opinions. Often times who and what becomes popular is simply what just happens to catch on with an already popular celebrity or group and so it spreads.

Why are we listening to the world on the subject of how to think and live and what's important? GOD has already told us how to think and live... and it's not of this world (**I John 2:15**). And as far as popularity, we should only be worried about being "popular" in GOD's eyes.

We are often told what to wear, what to have, what to do, how to think, and what to be. It doesn't really matter what we wear, as long as we are clothing ourselves as GOD wishes. It doesn't really matter what we have, as long as our needs are met, and the Bible tells us not to worry about that (**Luke 12:22-34**). It doesn't really matter what we do, as long as we're doing GOD's will. It doesn't really matter what we are to be, as long as we are of GOD.

However, it does matter how we think. We should strive to have the mind of CHRIST (**Phil. 2:5**). Isn't it interesting that all the other things that are what we do and look like on the outside are not near as important as what's on the inside? GOD wants our heart to be clean, and when our hearts are clean, then the rest of us will follow!



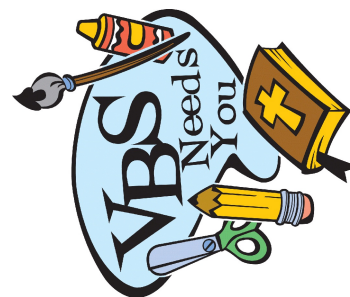
The church office will be closed on Monday, May 30th in observance of Memorial Day.
