Burden Shop


The SWAT team (Skits With A Truth) does a skit having a guy that goes to the burden store to exchange his burden. The guy comes in dragging his burden, hoping to make a trade. The shop owner takes the burden and places it in his shop agreeing to make a trade with him. As they look at 2 or 3 from the warehouse of different burdens to choose from, they are one by one dismissed for how much of a burden they would be. The one who is trying to trade his original burden finally comes across a tiny burden that he has decided upon. The shop owner acts surprised and dismayed at his request. The shop owner tells him he cannot have that burden "because that's the burden you came in with! I can't give it back to you." The guy realizes just how small of a burden he brought in compared to the rest.

I really like this particular skit and have seen them perform it multiple times. It is so easy to think our own burdens are so heavy and unbearable until we are able to compare them to others. There is almost always someone that has more on their plate than we do. It's like the old saying, "you don't know what you have until it's gone." Similarly, "you don't know how good you have it until you see someone who has it much worse."

However, the real take away is not whether we have it good or bad, but rather to focus on GOD and what He's done for us instead. Focus on living for Him, serving others and our end reward of heaven! It doesn't do us any good to dwell on our burdens/problems.
