From Where I Sit . . .

“Loving The Brethren”

Churches aren't like businesses even though there are some aspects of overseeing a local church that require good business sense. No one gets fired from church for failing to show up for duty (well, almost no one). You see, in the church we depend entirely on a voluntary committal to one another and to God in matters of Love, Unity, Peace and Harmony, Cooperation and One Another Spirit, Mutual Sharing or fellowship in the “Like Precious Faith,” plus Work and Worship.

Someone might attempt to make the case that it would be better if we had the “business-type” control over employees where we could just make things happen the way management wants them to be. However, the Lord has heavenly wisdom, and His thoughts are higher than our thoughts. He designed a workable plan for the church's survival and growth even though our participation is voluntary.

It's hard to beat these: Voluntary Love, Unity, Peace, Harmony, Cooperation, and the “One Another Spirit,” of the “Like Precious Faith, along with sharing in Work and Worship..” We need all of these attributes in the church for a congregation to truly be strong in the Lord. But think for a moment: coercion doesn't produce love. The very nature of loving has to do with choosing. We've watched on television video footage of thousands of people who live in dictatorships who are compelled to show loyalty and love to their ruler. Very few people in such audiences are there out of genuine love but rather out of fear of retaliation if they should refuse to pay homage.

Loving God and loving our brethren is a strong theme found within Scripture.

Heb 13:1 (KJV) “Let brotherly love continue.”

1 Pet 3:8 (KJV) “Finally, be ye all of one mind, having compassion one of another, love as brethren, be pitiful, be courteous:”

1 Cor 16:14 (KJV) “Let all your things be done with charity.”

Ephesians 4:1 - 3 (KJV) ¹I therefore, the prisoner of the Lord, beseech you that ye walk worthy of the vocation wherewith ye are called, ²With all lowliness and meekness, with longsuffering, forbearing one another in love; ³Endeavouring to keep the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace

The Psalmist writes in **Psa 133:1 (KJV) “Behold, how good and how pleasant it is for brethren to dwell together in unity!”** Great work programs as designed on paper will not accomplish by themselves what “love of the brotherhood,” and “unity of the spirit” can accomplish even without those programs.

Jesus draws us to love, **John 4:10-11 (KJV) ¹⁰Herein is love, not that we loved God, but that he loved us, and sent his Son to be the propitiation for our sins. ¹¹Beloved, if God so loved us, we ought also to love one another.**

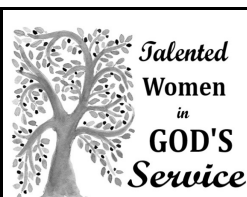
