From Where I Sit...

When I first started teaching one of the major tools we used was a chalk board. I know that these have just about become obsolete. One of the major problems with using a chalk board is that it is almost impossible to keep clean. No matter how much we tried it seemed we could never get rid of the dust created by the chalk.

These old chalk boards can help us as Christians as we try to understand sin in our life. Sin can be represented by the writing that is made on a chalk board. Sin imprints our lives and stays there until it is removed. It is true the blood of Jesus washes away our sins, "Hebrews 9: 13 - 14 [13] For if the blood of bulls and goats and the ashes of a heifer, sprinkling the unclean, sanctifies for the purifying of the flesh, [14] how much more shall the blood of Christ, who through the eternal Spirit offered Himselfwithout spot to God, cleanse your conscience from dead works to serve the living God?" Peter makes this clear in "I Peter 1: 18 - 19 [18] knowing that you were not redeemed with corruptible things, like silver or gold, from your aimless conduct received by tradition from your fathers, [19] but with the precious blood of Christ, as of a lamb without blemish and without spot." Sin is no longer held against us by the one who judges our lives. However there is a residue of sin that is left in our memory. Even though we try to put these remnants of sin behind us as Paul instructs us to do in "Philippians 3: 13 - 14 [13] Brethren, I do not count myself to have apprehended; but one thing I do, forgetting those things which are behind and reaching forward to those things which are ahead, [14] Ipress toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus," we still remember our sins.

Remembering our sin may not be a bad thing. For one thing it keeps us humble. Remember Paul's attitude toward his own sins, **"I Timothy 1: 15 [15] This is a faithful saying and worthy of all acceptance, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners, of whom I am chief."** Remembering our sins can also be a constant reminder of the love of God and the grace that He has extended to us. Remembering our sin can also be a reminder of how much we have grown in our faith. Remembering our sin can also help us become more determined to keep sin away from our lives. So this remnant of sin in our memory can help us if we do not let sin keep us from moving forward. Remember Paul recalled he was the chiefest of all sinners, yet he kept pressing toward the high calling of God.

We all have sin in our past but by the grace of God we can move forward to overcome this sin and to grow in our faith. Our sin should remind us of the love and the grace God has demonstrated to us. This should lead us to be eternally grateful to our Great and Awesome God!!!

A mother was a daughter at one point in her life. A mother might have been a sister, before she was a wife.


