From Where I Sit . . .

"ARE WE DEDICATED TO GOD?"

I once watched a tight rope walker walk across Niagara Falls. In his interview, he said it was a lifelong dream. This means he had been thinking about this and preparing for this his entire life. It is obvious to me that this man had to be thoroughly dedicated to this dream. He had to be constantly thinking about accomplishing this and he had to be constantly preparing for the day he would accomplish this feat. It also amazed me that he was willing to commit himself to accomplish something that would only last for a fleeting moment.

This got me thinking. As a Christian, we do not have a dream of eternal life, we have a hope. An earnest expectation of a life living with God forever. We also with the help of God have an accomplishment that will simply not be momentary, but it will be eternal. The question we might need to ask ourselves is, "*Are we dedicated to making this eternal life a reality?*"

What does dedication look like? It looks like a person that thinks about this goal all the time. The Bible tells us we should meditate on the things that bring eternal life, **Philippians 4: 8 - 9**, "**[8] Finally, brethren, whatever things are true, whatever things are noble, whatever things are just, whatever things are pure, whatever things are lovely, whatever things are of good report, if there is any virtue and if there is anything praiseworthy—meditate on these things. [9] The things which you learned and received and heard and saw in me, these do, and the God of peace will be with you.**" It looks like the person that studies to make sure he is doing everything possible to accomplish this task, **II Timothy 2: 15**, "**[15] Be diligent to present yourself approved to God, a worker who does not need to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth.**" It looks like the person that is trying to find every advantage he can find to make this happen, **Romans 12: 2**, "**[2] And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, that you may prove what is that good and acceptable and perfect will of God.**" Dedication also looks like the man that every day is willing to put in the work to make his goal a reality. Notice what the Bible says about the way a Christian should work every day to make eternal life a reality, **I Corinthians 9: 24 - 27**, "**[24] Do you not know that those who run in a race all run, but one receives the prize? Run in such a way that you may obtain it. [25] And everyone who competes for the prize is temperate in all things. Now they do it to obtain a perishable crown, but we for an imperishable crown. [26] Therefore I run thus: not with uncertainty. Thus I fight: not as one who beats the air. [27] But I discipline my body and bring it into subjection, lest, when I have preached to others, I myself should become disqualified.**"

This tight rope walker did all he did for a momentary reward that only lasted for a few minutes. Shouldn't we do more for the great reward of eternal life? How dedicated are we.

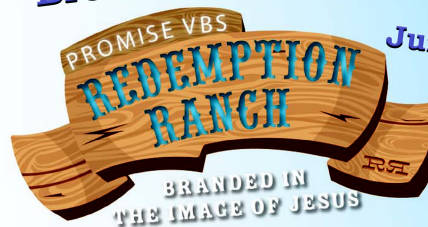

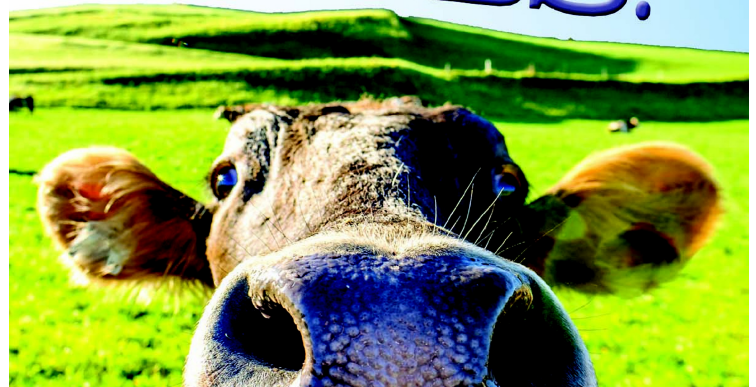

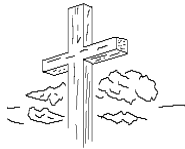
