"MORAL COURAGE"

One of the greatest challenges in this life is to have moral courage in one's own life and to have moral courage to evaluate others not by their physical abilities or their earthly accomplishments but by their character. It is hard not to see how this played out in the child abuse scandal that rocked Penn State University a few years ago. Coach Joe Paterno for years had been admired by thousands for the success he had on the football field, his generosity to his beloved university, and his ethical stance on following the rules established by the governing body of the NCAA. However, in the latter stages of his career, all anyone wanted to discuss was his pursuit and the attainment of the all-time career winning record for a division I football coach. I wonder how much this praise and attention and hype caused him to admit in his own words to not "do enough" when this sex scandal happened. I wonder how much his perspective was warped by the constant pressure to win and to bring the football program into elite status and to bring his beloved university the positive attention of accomplishing this goal. Did all this weaken Joe Paterno's moral courage? Did it lead him to hide the sin so the reputation of the football program and his beloved university that he had given so much of himself to would not be tarnished? All the hard work he had put into this, all the sacrifices he had made, and all the good he had done, would it all be wiped away by the selfish act of one man, one man's sin? We cannot begin to know what must have gone through the mind of Coach Paterno, but the fact remains that in a time that demanded moral courage, he stood by and in his own words, "did not do enough." We cannot take the place of God. We cannot judge and condemn others, notice Romans 2:1 -3. "[2:1] Therefore you are inexcusable, O man, whoever you are who judge, for in whatever you judge another you condemn yourself; for you who judge practice the same things. [2] But we know that the judgment of God is according to truth against those who practice such things. [3] And do you think this, O man, you who judge those practicing such things, and doing the same, that you will escape the judgment of God?" We are not to judge nor condemn, but there is a time and a place for moral courage.

Coach Paterno judged that sin should not come to light and thus he sinned by not dealing with the sin. Moral courage means dealing with sin in a straight forward way. It may mean that we avoid sin by standing firm against it. But moral courage also comes when we handle sin that has already been committed whether that is sin in our own lives or sin in the lives of others. First moral courage must begin with us when it comes to our own sin. David may have been a great example of this moral courage when it come to our own sin notice II Samuel 12: 12 - 14, "[13] So David said to Nathan, "I have sinned against the LORD." And Nathan said to David, "The LORD also has put away your sin; you shall not die. [14] "However, because by this deed you have given great occasion to the enemies of the LORD to blaspheme, the child also who is born to you shall surely die." David when confronted with his own sin with Bathsheba immediately had the courage to confess his sin and to accept the consequences of that sin. But there is another lesson to be learned in moral courage and that is the courage to help a brother that has sinned. We need to go to our brother with the intent of helping him develop the moral courage to admit his sin and to accept the consequences of his sin and to help him overcome his sin. Notice Galatians 6: 1- 5, "[6:1] Brethren, if a man is overtaken in any trespass, you who are spiritual restore such a one in a spirit of gentleness, considering yourself lest you also be tempted. [2] Bear one another's burdens, and so fulfill the law of Christ. [3] For if anyone thinks himself to be something, when he is nothing, he deceives himself. [4] But let each one examine his own work, and then he will have rejoicing in himself alone, and not in another. [5] For each one shall bear his own load." Developing moral courage will not eliminate our hardships that come from sin but it will help save our eternal soul and help others develop the moral courage to save their eternal souls.


