From Where I Sit . . .

"CONSIDER OUR WORSHIP"

Have you ever taken the time to consider your worship to God? Since God is seeking those who will worship Him, it is important to spend some time contemplating the importance and the necessity of worshiping God, our Creator. When we come to an understanding of who God truly is, the natural response should be to offer to Him all that He desires from us. Maybe this is why Paul penned these words to the Romans in Romans 12: 1 - 2, "[12:1] I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that you present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable to God, which is your reasonable service. [2] And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, that you may prove what is that good and acceptable and perfect will of God." All we have to give to God in reality is ourselves. Our worship to God means that we are truly giving ourselves to the praise and the honor of the One who gives us everything.

When we take a look at the five items of public worship to God, we need to keep in mind that true worship is a sacrifice of ourselves to God. When we hear the message of God proclaimed in worship, it should be a complete sacrifice of our will to the will of God. It is to completely sacrifice our own way of thinking to embrace God's way of thinking, Isaiah 55: 8 - 9, "[8] "For My thoughts are not your thoughts, Nor are your ways My ways," says the LORD. [9] "For as the heavens are higher than the earth, So are My ways higher than your ways, And My thoughts than your thoughts." We should drink deeply from God's word as we worship Him. When we pray, we must demonstrate our respect for God and our gratitude for God acknowledging Him as the one who gives us all things. Notice how Jesus taught His disciples to pray in Matthew 6: 9 - 13, "[9] "In this manner, therefore, pray: Our Father in heaven, Hallowed be Your name. [10] Your kingdom come. Your will be done On earth as it is in heaven. [11] Give us this day our daily bread. 12] And forgive us our debts, As we forgive our debtors. [13] And do not lead us into temptation, But deliver us from the evil one. For Yours is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever. Amen." We should pray that we can empty ourselves and be filled with God. When we sing, we should sing with our hearts in praise of God who has done so much for us and continues to do so much for us. We also sing to provide instruction for others about the great God we serve. Our singing should come from ourselves and not from any outside source since it is our worship to God. We need to remember God is seeking those who will personally offer their worship to Him. Singing is our outward demonstration of the joy within us created by God, Colossians 3: 16, "[16] Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly in all wisdom, teaching and admonishing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing with grace in your hearts to the Lord." When we partake of the Lord's Supper, we are to personally remember the love of God who sent His Son and the love of the Son who died for us. We remember the lengths God and His Son went to make us a part of their family. We remember the price that was paid for us and the hope we have in Christ, I Corinthians 11: 23 - 26, "[23] For I received from the Lord that which I also delivered to you: that the Lord Jesus on the same night in which He was betrayed took bread; [24] and when He had given thanks, He broke it and said, "Take, eat; this is My body which is broken for you; do this in remembrance of Me." [25] In the same manner He also took the cup after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in My blood. This do, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me." [26] For as often as you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death till He comes."

Our worship is not only a praise and a show of gratitude for what God has done and continues to do for us personally, but it is a motivation to sacrifice ourselves individually to God. Our worship should be this personal sacrifice to Him. God demands worship and this sacrifice, John 4: 23 - 24, "[23] "But the hour is coming, and now is, when the true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and truth; for the Father is seeking such to worship Him. [24] "God is Spirit, and those who worship Him must worship in spirit and truth." May we always seek to worship God in spirit and in truth.

Giving Back to Jesus

The little book of Jude begins with some big reminders for Christians of all ages (both in time periods and in years). Let's examine three from the first three verses.

Always put Jesus first (v.1). The author of the epistle, Jude, was the half brother of Jesus Christ. And yet, rather than boasting about that, he referred to himself as, "a bondservant of Jesus Christ." First and foremost he considered himself a servant of Jesus. We would also do well to put Jesus first place in our lives. First consideration in everything we do should be Jesus and His will. He is our Master every moment of every day.

Always remember that Jesus has saved us (v.1). Jude reminded his readers that they had been "called, sanctified by God the Father, and preserved in Jesus Christ." Christians need to constantly bring to mind that they were called out of the world by the gospel of Christ, sanctified by contacting the blood of Christin baptism, and are preserved by the grace of God through faithfulness in Christ. It is vital to keep this on the forefront of our minds.

Always be living for Jesus (v.3). Jude's exhortation was to continue to "contend earnestly for the faith." As important as putting Jesus Christ first and remembering that He has saved us are, it is equally important to always live for Him in word and deed. Many false teachers and false notions abound, and we must be the ones to live and speak the truth concerning Jesus and His will. The Greek word translated "contend earnestly" was often used in reference to an athlete striving hard. Thus it is a reminder to us that living this way and speaking the truth is going to take a lot of concentrated, dedicated effort.

Another way of looking at these thoughts is that we need to be giving backto Jesus. He has given us so much (salvation, blessings, assistance, etc.). Let us in appreciation give Himfirst place in our lives, give remembrance to what He has done for us, and give Him a faithful life that honors and proclaims Him. Let's always give back to the One who has unselfishly given to us.
