From Where I Sit . . .

“SUBMISSION IS NOT A DIRTY WORD”

The word “submission” has been truly perverted in our society today. In the world we live in, because of men’s selfish desires, the word “submission” has come to mean that one has given up because of his own weakness or has allowed someone to rule over them. God never intended for this word “submission” to have this meaning. The word “submission” used in the New Testament means to voluntarily submit one’s will to the will of another for two basic reasons. One reason is to submit to the will of another in order to gain something better for one’s life. We submit to the will of God in order to obtain a better life here and to obtain eternal life. Another reason we submit is to keep a God given order, I Corinthians 11: 8 - 12, “[8] For man is not from woman, but woman from man. [9] Nor was man created for the woman, but woman for the man. [10] For this reason the woman ought to have a symbol of authority on her head, because of the angels. [11] Nevertheless, neither is man independent of woman, nor woman independent of man, in the Lord. [12] For as woman came from man, even so man also comes through woman; but all things are from God.” This verse tells us that there has to be submission in order to preserve the order that God established from the very beginning. So “submission” was meant to be something that would bring us a better life that has order and not chaos.

Submission never was intended to bring with it a rule over someone mentality. Submission was to bring with it a totally different type of leadership than this. The leadership that was suppose to come with submission can be described best by three passages, John 13: 12 - 17, “[12] So when He had washed their feet, taken His garments, and sat down again, He said to them, “Do you know what I have done to you? [13] “You call Me Teacher and Lord, and you say well, for so I am. [14] “If I then, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another’s feet. [15] “For I have given you an example, that you should do as I have done to you. [16] “Most assuredly, I say to you, a servant is not greater than his master; nor is he who is sent greater than he who sent him. [17] “If you know these things, blessed are you if you do them.”; Luke 22: 25 - 27, “[25] And He said to them, “The kings of the Gentiles exercise lordship over them, and those who exercise authority over them are called ‘benefactors.’ [26] “But not so among you; on the contrary, he who is greatest among you, let him be as the younger, and he who governs as he who serves. [27] “For who is greater, he who sits at the table, or he who serves? Is it not he who sits at the table? Yet I am among you as the One who serves.”; and Ephesians 5: 22 - 29, “[22] Wives, submit to your own husbands, as to the Lord. [23] For the husband is head of the wife, as also Christ is head of the church; and He is the Savior of the body. [24] Therefore, just as the church is subject to Christ, so let the wives be to their own husbands in everything. [25] Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ also loved the church and gave Himself for her, [26] that He might sanctify and cleanse her with the washing of water by the word, [27] that He might present her to Himself a glorious church, not having spot or wrinkle or any such thing, but that she should be holy and without blemish. [28] So husbands ought to love their own wives as their own bodies; he who loves his wife loves himself. [29] For no one ever hated his own flesh, but nourishes and cherishes it, just as the Lord does the church.” These passages teach us that true leadership involves serving those who have submitted to that leadership.

Christ was the perfect example of both of these roles. He was submissive to God in order to save His creation. He was also the perfect leader in that He sacrificed all in order to benefit those who had submitted to Him. May we see “submission” as the wonderful thing that God created it to be.

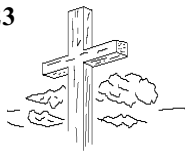
