I recently watched some film of a tight rope walker who was attempting to tight rope walk over Niagara Falls. In his interview, he said that this had been a lifelong dream of his.

He went on to say that he had been preparing his whole life for this one moment. Can you imagine working your entire life for something that will only last a few short minutes? I was truly amazed at his accomplishment as I watched him slowly and carefully walk across those dangerous falls. As I was watching this unfold, I could not help but think of my own dedication to God. This man truly was dedicated to his lifelong dream. Was I this dedicated to my lifelong dream? This type of dedication means that you have to be pushed outside your comfort zone in order to accomplish such a feat. Had I allowed my dedication to God to push me outside my comfort zone in order to attain what I wanted so desperately? Thomas Carlyle said, "Have a purpose and throw all your weight behind it."

Thinking about these things led me to keep asking myself the question, "Am I truly dedicated to the purpose that God has given me?" I thought is my lifelong dream truly to serve God faithfully in order to live with Him eternally? I thought have I been pursuing this lifelong desire by putting in the work necessary to bring this to fruition? We have many examples in scripture of people who did just this very thing. Daniel showed us you can do this even if you are a slave in a foreign land, Daniel 1: 8, "[8] But Daniel purposed in his heart that he would not defile himself with the portion of the king's delicacies, nor with the wine which he drank; therefore he requested of the chief of the eunuchs that he might not defile himself." Peter reminds us that we should be busy doing these things in our lives, II Peter 1: 10, "[10] Therefore, brethren, be even more diligent to make your call and election sure, for if you do these things you will never stumble." This dedication to God allows us to put in the work to insure that we have done all we can do to make our lifelong dream of being with God for eternity a reality. This dedication to God keeps us from slipping away from this dream, Hebrews 2: 1 - 4, "[2:1] Therefore we must give the more earnest heed to the things we have heard, lest we drift away. [2] For if the word spoken through angels proved steadfast, and every transgression and disobedience received a just reward, [3] how shall we escape if we neglect so great a salvation, which at the first began to be spoken by the Lord, and was confirmed to us by those who heard Him, [4] God also bearing witness both with signs and wonders, with various miracles, and gifts of the Holy Spirit, according to His own will?"

This tightrope walker spent an entire life dedicated to fulfilling a lifelong dream of walking across Niagara Falls which only took a few short minutes and the moment was gone. Surely we can dedicate our lives to God to fulfill our desire to live with Him eternally.
