From Where I Sit... "LESSON LEARNED FROM GEESE"

Few sights evoke as much attention as a large flock of geese as they make their way across the sky. Their constant honking reminds us the seasons are about to change whether they are headed south for the winter or north for the summer. When I look at these majestic birds, I am reminded of several wonderful bible lessons we can learn from these geese.

First we can learn some things about working together by the way they fly across the sky. That famous V-formation is very practical to the way they travel and the miles they have to cover. Each bird is positions itself perfectly in a position to be uplifted by the bird in front of them so they fly with less effort. As the leader of The V begins to tire, he moves to the back and a stronger bird takes his place. This occurs so they can fly greater distances without tiring. They work in perfect unison to make sure they carry out their purposes. The stronger ones lead the weaker ones and the weaker ones are aided by the stronger ones. Maybe God is telling us that we should follow this example in the work of the church, I Corinthians 12: 12 - 26, "[12] For as the body is one and has many members, but all the members of that one body, being many, are one body, so also is Christ. [13] For by one Spirit we were all baptized into one body-whether Jews or Greeks, whether slaves or free-and have all been made to drink into one Spirit. [14] For in fact the body is not one member but many. [15] If the foot should say, "Because I am not a hand, I am not of the body," is it therefore not of the body? [16] And if the ear should say, "Because I am not an eye, I am not of the body," is it therefore not of the body? [17] If the whole body were an eye, where would be the hearing? If the whole were hearing, where would be the smelling? [18] But now God has set the members, each one of them, in the body just as He pleased. [19] And if they were all one member, where would the body be? [20] But now indeed there are many members, yet one body. [21] And the eye cannot say to the hand, "I have no need of you"; nor again the head to the feet, "I have no need of you." [22] No, much rather, those members of the body which seem to be weaker are necessary. [23] And those members of the body which we think to be less honorable, on these we bestow greater honor; and our unpresentable parts have greater modesty, [24] but our presentable parts have no need. But God composed the body, having given greater honor to that part which lacks it, [25] that there should be no schism in the body, but that the members should have the same care for one another. [26] And if one member suffers, all the members suffer with it; or if one member is honored, all the members rejoice with it."

We also learn that they will never leave one alone that has to drop out of the group. This may occur because of weakness, illness, injury or simply old age. One or more members of the group will stay with this one until he can rejoin another group or until he dies. Doesn't this remind us of what God has instructed us to do in Galatians 6: 1 - 2, "[6:1] Brethren, if a man is overtaken in any trespass, you who are spiritual restore such a one in a spirit of gentleness, considering yourself lest you also be tempted. [2] Bear one another's burdens, and so fulfill the law of Christ."

We also learn that geese mate for life. They understand the commitment and no matter what happens will stay with their mate until death. This is not only what God intended for us when it comes to marriage, but it is what He intended our relationship with Him to be. Notice Ephesians 5: 31 - 33, "[31] "For this reason a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh." [32] This is a great mystery, but I speak concerning Christ and the church. [33] Nevertheless let each one of you in particular so love his own wife as himself, and let the wife see that she respects her husband."

God gives geese these instincts that drive their behavior and they trust completely in these instincts. God has given us His word to drive our behavior and to develop a trust in His word. Maybe we need to become more like geese.




