# From Where I Sit . . .

## LESSONS LEARNED FROM QUAIL

An old legend is told of a covey of quail that lived in a forest. They had only one powerful enemy, the quail catcher. He would imitate their call and when a few would gather together he would throw a net over them. After he captured them, he would take them to the market

and sell them. The quail finally thought something had to be done. One wise quail came up with a marvelous plan. If the net were thrown over them, they would all at one time in perfect unison begin to fly skyward. The plan worked so well that the quail catcher was to the point of going out of business. But then something strange began to happen, the quail began to fight amongst themselves over who was carrying more of the weight during these escape attempts. Each quail thought they were doing all the work or at least the majority of the work. The old quail catcher saw his opportunity. He imitated the quail call and threw his net. This time, preoccupied with their quarreling, the birds no longer helped one another and were caught and sold in the market.

There are three simple, yet powerful lessons to be learned from the quail. The first lesson is very obvious, we must meet together for there is power in numbers. The birds could not accomplish escape from their enemy by themselves, and neither can we. The Hebrew writer says in Hebrews 10: 23 - 25, "[23] Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for He who promised is faithful. [24] And let us consider one another in order to stir up love and good works, [25] not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as is the manner of some, but exhorting one another, and so much the more as you see the Day approaching." One of the major reasons we meet together is so we can lean on the strength of one another.

The second lesson we can learn from the quail is that when we work together as a unit there is nothing that we cannot accomplish. God made an interesting observation as He watched those who were trying to build the tower of Babel, Genesis 11: 5 - 6, "5] But the LORD came down to see the city and the tower which the sons of men had built. [6] And the LORD said, "Indeed the people are one and they all have one language, and this is what they begin to do; now nothing that they propose to do will be withheld from them." The whole point of Jesus coming to this earth was to remove sin so we could be unified with God and overcome all our enemies. Notice the prayer of Jesus found in John 17: 20 - 23, "[20] "I do not pray for these alone, but also for those who will believe in Me through their word; [21] "that they all may be one, as You, Father, are in Me, and I in You; that they also may be one in Us, that the world may believe that You sent Me. [22] "And the glory which You gave Me I have given them, that they may be one just as We are one: [23] "I in them, and You in Me; that they may be made perfect in one, and that the world may know that You have sent Me, and have loved them as You have loved Me."

The third lesson we can learn from the quail is when we quarrel and fight amongst ourselves all it does is separate us from this oneness and make us vulnerable to our enemies. Look at what James tells us about this quarreling, James 4: 1 - 3, "[4:1] Where do wars and fights come from among you? Do they not come from your desires for pleasure that war in your members? [2] You lust and do not have. You murder and covet and cannot obtain. You fight and war. Yet you do not have because you do not ask. [3] You ask and do not receive, because you ask amiss, that you may spend it on your pleasures." Sin separates us from God and from one another. This is exactly what the Devil is waiting on, I Peter 5: 8, "[8] Be sober, be vigilant; because your adversary the devil walks about like a roaring lion, seeking whom he may devour." We need to learn the lessons of the quail.
