From Where I Sit...

"FROM SMALL TO GREAT"

One of the great principles of the kingdom of God is the growth principle. This principle can be found in several teachings, but is clearly defined in Galatians 6: 7 - 8, "[7] Do not be deceived, God is not mocked; for whatever a man sows, that he will also reap. [8] For he who sows to his flesh will of the flesh reap corruption, but he who

sows to the Spirit will of the Spirit reap everlasting life." Whatever is sown will produce of its own kind. This morning we will be given two passages that will help expand upon this principle of growth.

The first passage can be found in Matthew 13: 31 – 32, "[31] Another parable He put forth to them, saying: "The kingdom of heaven is like a mustard seed, which a man took and sowed in his field, [32] "which indeed is the least of all the seeds; but when it is grown it is greater than the herbs and becomes a tree, so that the birds of the air come and nest in its branches." Jesus compares the seed of the Kingdom of God with a mustard seed. The mustard seed is one of the smallest seeds. How does this compare with the seed of the Kingdom or the Word of God? This seed being small is like the Word of God that it is sown in one simple heart. From the outset it does not seem as if it can make a significant difference. The mustard seed once it is planted in good soil produces one of the largest of the herbs. The Word of God when planted in the good soil of a good heart also grows. It not only grows inside the individual who receives and obeys the Word of God, but it spreads to others through that individual carrying out the mission of Christ. We are told in Ephesians 2: 10, "[10] For we are His work manship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand that we should walk in them." When we are actively doing these good works we bring honor and glory to God by demonstrating the change the seed planted in us has made, Matthew 5: 14 – 16, "[14] "You are the light of the world. A city that is set on a hill cannot be hidden. [15] "Nor do they light a lamp and put it under a basket, but on a lampstand, and it gives light to all who are in the house. [16] "Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven." These good works draw others to want to know why these changes have occurred in our lives giving us the opportunity to present the seed of the Kingdom, the Word of God, to others, Mark 16: 15 -16, "[15] And He said to them, "Go into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature. [16] "He who believes and is baptized will be saved; but he who does not believe will be condemned. Thus the Kingdom of God begins small with one individual and then spreads to other individuals and becomes something much, much larger than could be expected. This mustard plant then become large enough to provide a home for the needy. The Kingdom of God is to be a place for those who are needy and hurting and lost. Notice Matthew 11: 28 - 30, "[28] "Come to Me, all you who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. [29] "Take My yoke upon you and learn from Me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. [30] "For My yoke is easy and My burden is light."

The second passage can be found in Matthew 13: 33, "[33] Another parable He spoke to them: "The kingdom of heaven is like leaven, which a woman took and hid in three measures of meal till it was all leavened." Here the seed of the Kingdom, the Word of God, is placed into the lump, the lump being the world. Notice it says the leaven was hidden in the lump. It means the Word of God did not come into the world with a loud bang, but through the quiet means of the teaching of men. God relies upon men to bring the seed or leaven or Word of God by the simple means of teaching the word. Notice Romans 10: 14 – 15, "[14] How then shall they call on Him in whom they have not believed? And how shall they believe in Him of whom they have not heard? And how shall they hear without a preacher? [15] And how shall they preach unless they are sent? As it is written: "How beautiful are the feet of those who preach the gospel of peace, Who bring glad tidings of good things!" Like leaven in the lump, the gospel or the Word of God is spread by carrying out the Great Commission, Matthew 28: 19 – 20, "[19] "Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, [20] "teaching them to observe all things that I have commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, even to the end of the age." Amen." The three measures of meal represents the entire world. God expects us to help Him take the Word of God to the entire world in each generation. He wants every man to have the opportunity to hear and to obey the gospel.

We often get overwhelmed thinking we cannot possibly accomplish such a monumental feat such as this. These passages are given to us to reassure us this can be done. It is also to instruct us that we are never doing this alone. But we can rest assured that with the help of God we can accomplish what he wants us to accomplish. Notice Ephesians 3: 20 - 21, "[20] Now to Him who is able to do exceedingly abundantly above all that we ask or think, according to the power that works in us, [21] to Him be glory in the church by Christ Jesus to all generations, forever and ever. Amen."
