# "OUR CHRISTIAN STRENGTH"

The Golden Gate Bridge is recognized as an engineering marvel. It is regarded as a masterpiece of structural strength. Yet, the giant cables that support this giant structure were woven by an ingenious little machine. This marvelous little machine traveled the length of those massive support cables leaving behind the strengthening influence of a single strand of wire. This little machine takes one strand at a time until the cable wires were strong enough to support that massive structure that has become so recognizable as a symbol of strength.

The mature Christian strength is supplied to us in much the same way, one characteristic at a time. Peter illustrates this truth by urging us to, II Peter 1: 5 - 7, "[5] But also for this very reason, giving all diligence, add to your faith virtue, to virtue knowledge, [6] to knowledge self-control, to self-control perseverance, to perseverance godliness, [7] to godliness brotherly kindness, and to brotherly kindness love." One cannot expect in an instant to attain the maturity and strength in the Lord that can only come through seasoning of time. We are encouraged to begin to grow as newborn babies through the seasoning of time, I Peter 2: 2, "[2] as newborn babes, desire the pure milk of the word, that you may grow thereby." And like newborn babes we are to grow into mature Christians able, capable, and willing to take on the strong meats of being a Christian, that is growing in our faith, Hebrews 5: 12, "[12] For though by this time you ought to be teachers, you need someone to teach you again the first principles of the oracles of God; and you have come to need milk and not solid food." The Hebrews writer is telling us that we must be willing to move from milk to the more meatier matters of this Christian life. We do this by adding one strand of faith at a time to the other strands or our faith. We do this until our faith becomes strong enough to support our lives here on this earth, Hebrews 5: 14, "[14] But solid food belongs to those who are of full age, that is, those who by reason of use have their senses exercised to discern both good and evil." We accomplish all of this through our own little machine that weaves these cords of a strong faith, the Word of God. But this Word will not benefit us if we do not allow this little machine to work, II Timothy 2: 15 - 16, "[15] Be diligent to present yourself approved to God, a worker who does not need to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth. [16] But shun profane and idle babblings, for they will increase to more ungodliness."

Our strength of faith will only be as strong as the Word of God constantly adds one more strand to our faith. May we be constantly be weaving these strands by allowing the little machine, the Word of God, to work in our lives.


