From Where I Sit . . .

"ENCOURAGEMENT FROM OTHERS"

Not long ago my wife and I had the honor and the privilege to walk with my son's basketball team in an event called, "Making Strides For Breast Cancer." There were people of all shapes and sizes, from all kinds of different backgrounds, some male, some female, some young, some old, people from all walks of life. It was truly amazing! It was estimated that over 30,000 people walked in unison to support this great cause. There were certain points along this five mile walk in which you could see just how many people were walking together this day. It was truly uplifting to see how many people were willing to give up their time and their effort to support this great cause. You could tell by the costumes, t-shirts, posters, and the amount of money raised that this was an important cause to so many.

As I walked in this event, I could not help but think of the passage found in Hebrews 12: 1 - 3, "[12:1] Therefore we also, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which so easily ensnares us, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, [2] looking unto Jesus, the author and finisher of our faith, who for the joy that was set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and has sat down at the right hand of the throne of God. [3] For consider Him who endured such hostility from sinners against Himself, lest you become weary and discouraged in your souls." We need the encouragement of seeing those who believe enough to sacrifice time and effort to benefit the great cause of Jesus Christ. This is one of the great reasons we are to assemble together on the first day of the week to be encouraged by others to work for the great cause of Christ, Hebrews 10: 19 - 25, "[19] Therefore, brethren, having boldness to enter the Holiest by the blood of Jesus, [20] by a new and living way which He consecrated for us, through the veil, that is, His flesh, [21] and having a High Priest over the house of God, [22] let us draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith, having our hearts sprinkled from an evil conscience and our bodies washed with pure water. [23] Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for He who promised is faithful. [24] And let us consider one another in order to stir up love and good works, [25] not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as is the manner of some, but exhorting one another, and so much the more as you see the Day approaching." I look around at our services every Sunday and I see brothers and sisters that are sacrificing so much to encourage others. I also see the number of people that truly believe in this great cause of Christ. I cannot begin to tell you how much this encourages me to keep walking in this great race.

It is also a reminder that there are others witnessing our walk for the cause of Christ. There were several times when walking up those hills became difficult. When you looked to the side of the road there were people lined up cheering the participants. It made the journey less difficult. We are assured that we have heavenly witnesses that are watching our walk and even though we cannot see them we can know they are there. This can give us the encouragement needed to keep walking when the walk becomes difficult.

God knew we would need this encouragement and this encouragement would give us strength and the boost we need to make it through difficult times. Every first day of the week we need to be reminded of this great encouragement of others and the encouragement we give to others. Remember there is always someone that needs this encouragement, God and others are counting on you to provide it.



Charging is important. Especially in the past 25 or so years, with the rise of smartphones and handheld technology, we are always looking for places to charge batteries. And depending on what the battery is powering and being used for, we may need that spot sooner rather than later. Ever noticed how running certain apps on your phone runs the battery down faster than others? Things like keeping the brightness up high or the volume too loud can do the same thing. And then our phones or computers get hot because the little fan inside is working over time to keep everything cool so it can still be used.

Maybe you've noticed something like this with yourself, too. The obvious comparison is sleep. You get energy by resting all night and the next day your mind and body are ready to take on whatever life throws at you. Rest and recharging yourself are both just as important as charging your phone. And not just physically, sometimes you need a mental break as well. Job stress can pile up quick. Family issues may not seem as easy to resolve as they should be. We have to go here, there, and everywhere, and all the while the talking heads on the news are saying whatever they can to make us feel like the sky will be falling any day now. Ever have a day where it feels like you just can't do anymore? That's usually because your brain is telling you it is trying to compute too much. Like that little fan in your computer telling you "We're too hot, we need to rest!", your mind and body sends you those signals, too.

Believe it or not, Jesus often took time for Himself to recharge. One example is in Matthew 14, after Jesus feeds the 5,000. The next big story after this is Jesus walking on water. But we often overlook what happens at the beginning of the chapter and here in the middle. Matthew 14 starts off with the story of John the Baptist's death. When Jesus hears it, probably because He had just lost a close friend and relative, and the one person who could kind of understand what He was going through, He goes to be alone. Jesus was sad and tired and now had to deal with real loss in His life, and probably was forced to confront the reality of the death He would die in a way He had not yet had to. And yes, when people followed Him there, Jesus still served and took care of them, but after that verse 23 says, "After he had dismissed them, he went up on a mountainside by himself to pray. Later that night, he was there alone..." After being surrounded by people and teaching them Jesus saw it was important to take care of Himself so that He could continue to do His best work, and when that time was interrupted, He still made sure to make more of it later. In the busy seasons of life, we often forget to recharge. So, remember even Jesus took time to slow down and rest.
