From Where I Sit . . .

"EVERYTHING HAS A PURPOSE"

As I sit here at my desk wondering what to write for this week's bulletin article, this passage in Ecclesiastes 3: 1, "[3:1] To everything there is a season, A time

for every purpose under heaven," keeps coming into my mind. It is one of my favorite passages for it reminds me that God has a purpose for all things that occur in our lives. Our lives with everything that happens to us whether it is by our own choices, the choice of others, or simply the circumstances of life. God takes these things and He uses these things to carry out His purposes.

This is a great thing for us to know for when difficult things come we have a tendency to forget this principle. I doubt Job could see how God would use the difficult situations that occurred in his life to help us and others see that God is always there to help us through even the most difficult of life's circumstances. I doubt Job could see that things would be even better in the end than they were in the beginning. See God used the difficulties in Job's life to prove that He helps us overcome our difficulties so the end is better than the beginning. I doubt that Peter looking into the eyes of Jesus after he betrayed him three times could see Jesus would help him overcome these difficult circumstances. Jesus would help Peter overcome these difficulties to be the one who would open up the kingdom of God to those who believed. Peter's end was also better than the beginning. It is obvious in these illustrations that God works alongside us to help us overcome our difficulties to carry out His purposes.

This reminds me of a great principle of life. Life is a series of obstacles we must overcome to be what we will become. God works alongside us to overcome these obstacles that are placed in our way, Matthew 11: 28 - 30, "[28] "Come to Me, all you who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. [29] "Take My yoke upon you and learn from Me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. [30] "For My yoke is easy and My burden is light." God uses these obstacles to carry out His purposes in our lives. We must remember, as this passage remind us, God will carry out His purposes at just the right time. We must allow the time for God to carry out His purposes. Overcoming our obstacles leaves behind a heritage. This heritage can motivate others to overcome their obstacles. Notice the last verse, Ecclesiastes 3: 22, "[22] So I perceived that nothing is better than that a man should rejoice in his own works, for that is his heritage. For who can bring him to see what will happen after him?" What do we want our heritage to look like? One who gave in and quit when obstacles became difficult for us? Or one who took the challenge of obstacles and with God's help worked to overcome these obstacles? Isn't overcoming obstacles what Jesus did for us when he died on the cross? To those who overcome there is a great promise, Revelation 21: 7, "[7] "He who overcomes shall inherit all things, and I will be his God and he shall be My son." Truly the end will be better than the beginning.

God, Make Me "Very Good"

And God saw everything that he had made, and behold, it was very good. And there was evening and there was morning, the sixth day. -Genesis 1:31

It was only after God created man that He declared the Creation "very good." Keep this in mind.

God is very complex, so much so that when Moses asked His name, God declared Himself, "I AM WHAT I AM" (or "I am what I will be). This named denotes a Being in Whom there is no change, Someone Who is already perfect and complete- the embodiment of Goodness. So, whenever we read about God doing something, we can gain true and accurate insight into Who He is without fail. His ways are not our ways (Isaiah 55:8), so we may not always immediately understand God's plans or actions, but they will always fit into His nature.

So, we turn to the Creation. In seeing God create a beautiful Earth, we learn about His goodness. God is love and light, and Heis so good that He wants to share that. He creates this beautiful Earth as a testament to His power and glory, and ultimately, He creates a being capable of not just caring for it but enjoying the fruit of it as well. On the sixth day, God created man, and His declaration of the Creation being "very good" notes that man, a creature with freewill and the power to choose love and care for things, was the pinnacle of that Creation. Only man could have messed it up. And man did.

We see from Creation God wants to make things, and when He does make things, He makes them "very good". But there are only a few chapters between God declaring man "very good" and His choice to send a flood to destroy the world, except Noah and his family. So, man was good, and then he wasn't, and God, being a creator and cultivator, made a way for man to be reinvented as it were, for you and I to become "very good" once again through the power of Christ (II Corinthians 5:17).

I think we should ask ourselves this question: "Has God created me and my life?"

Now, the obvious answer is yes, God created all of us and everything else. But think about it from a more metaphorical, even ethereal sense. The life you lead now, has it been created and cultivated by God? Some of you are probably thinking, "Well, obviously." We know everything good, every blessing in life, it all comes from God. But much like man had the power to choose what he would do with what God gave him in the Garden of Eden, you have the power to choose what you will do with the things God gives you. Will you make decisions through prayer, with His guidance? Will you bear the Fruit of the Spirit? Will you search for wisdom and instruction as Solomon advises, or ask God for wisdom like James says we should. God gives the tools to build, and we choose we will allow Him to assist. Will you allow God to make your life "very good"?
