From Where I Sit . . .

"DOOM OR OPPORTUNITY"

Centuries ago, when mapmakers would run out of the known world at that time, at the edge of the parchment they would sketch a dragon. This dragon was the sign

to the explorer that he was entering a part of the world that was unknown. Many explorers looked at this dragon as a place on the map that once crossed would bring impending disaster and doom. This fear kept them from exploring their world beyond this charted map. Other more adventure-some explorers saw this same dragon on the map as a doorway of opportunity to explore new uncharted territory.

We live our lives every day within the limits of the things we have experienced or within the limits that we have come to know or our comfort zone. We also face things every day that push us to the edge of our comfort zone. A lot of these things could lead us to increase our service to God or some of them could lead us to do things in and with our lives to bring more honor and glory to God. Some of us see only the dragon at the end of our comfort zone so we allow fear to keep us from exploring these new possibilities. We are afraid to push ourselves beyond our comfort zone. Doesn't this sound a little like the one talent man in Matthew 25: 24 - 28, "[24] "Then he who had received the one talent came and said. 'Lord. I knew you to be a hard man, reaping where you have not sown, and gathering where you have not scattered seed. [25] 'And I was afraid, and went and hid your talent in the ground. Look, there you have what is yours.' [26] "But his lord answered and said to him, 'You wicked and lazy servant, you knew that I reap where I have not sown, and gather where I have not scattered seed. [27] 'So you ought to have deposited my money with the bankers, and at my coming I would have received back my own with interest. [28] 'Therefore take the talent from him, and give it to him who has ten talents." On the other hand the five talent man and the two talent man were also pushed to the edge of their comfort zones. Instead of being fearful, they embraced the challenge as an opportunity to widen their comfort zones. Notice what the Lord said about the five talent man in Matthew 25: 21,"[21] "His lord said to him, 'Well done, good and faithful servant; you were faithful over a few things, I will make you ruler over many things. Enter into the joy of your lord.", and to the two talent man in Matthew 25: 23, "[23] "His lord said to him, 'Well done, good and faithful servant; you have been faithful over a fewthings, I will make you ruler over many things. Enter into the joy of your lord."

When we see the dragon at the end of our comfort zone, do we cower in fear or do we embrace it as a challenge to broaden our comfort zone? The next time we are faced with the opportunity to broaden our comfort zone I hope we will allow the love God has for us to remove our fear, I John 4: 17 - 19, "[17] Love has been perfected among us in this: that we may have boldness in the day of judgment; because as He is, so are we in this world. [18] There is no fear in love; but perfect love casts out fear, because fear involves torment. But he who fears has not been made perfect in love. [19] We love Him because He first loved us." I hope we will embrace this opportunity to serve our Lord so others may see this and it will bring more glory and honor to the God who saved us.


