From Where I Sit . . . "DON'T FORGET TO ENCOURAGE"

Glen Van Ekeren tells us about an experience he had with his son one summer vacation. For the first couple of days, his son Matt, seemed to misbehave constantly. Glen seemed to be continuously rebuking and correcting this bad

behavior. He thought to himself, "No son of mine is going to act this way!" He made it abundantly clear to Matt that he expected a much different behavior than what Matt was demonstrating. Matt, who loved his father, tried very hard to live up to his father's strict expectations. In fact, there was one day later in the week in which Matt had not done anything that called for correction from his father. That night after Matt had said his prayers, Glenn noticed his son's bottom lip begin to quiver. "What is the matter, buddy?" he asked his son. Barely able to speak, Matt looked up at his dad and asked, "Daddy, haven't I been a good boy today?" Glen said those few simple words cut him to the heart. He had forgotten how important it was to praise and encourage his son for a job well done.

As I heard this story, it reminded me of how often we do not appreciate this part of our Christian worship. We live in a world that can be very harsh and critical when expectations are not being met. This is especially true for a Christian trying to please God while living in a critical secular world. We are surrounded by people who do not understand us, who feel that our lifestyle is wrong because it is different from theirs, and who are upset because we do not live according to their standards. Peter warns us about this in I Peter 4: 1 - 6, "[4:1] Therefore, since Christ suffered for us in the flesh, arm yourselves also with the same mind, for he who has suffered in the flesh has ceased from sin, [2] that he no longer should live the rest of his time in the flesh for the lusts of men, but for the will of God. [3] For we have spent enough of our past lifetime in doing the will of the Gentiles—when we walked in lewdness, lusts, drunkenness, revelries, drinking parties, and abominable idolatries. [4] In regard to these, they think it strange that you do not run with them in the same flood of dissipation, speaking evil of you. [5] They will give an account to Him who is ready to judge the living and the dead. [6] For this reason the gospel was preached also to those who are dead, that they might be judged according to men in the flesh, but live according to God in the spirit." We often forget that one of the reasons we assemble in worship is so we receive the much needed encouragement we need in order to continue doing the good works that God has set for us to do. Notice Hebrews 10: 23 - 25, "[23] Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for He who promised is faithful. [24] And let us consider one another in order to stir up love and good works, [25] not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as is the manner of some, but exhorting one another, and so much the more as you see the Day approaching." It is hard trying to live a life according to the lofty expectations of God the Father, for He has separated us from this world to live by a higher and more noble calling. Because we are trying so desperately to do this, we are highly criticized and chastised by a world that does not know us. Having someone recognize and approve of our hard work is something everyone appreciates and needs. This is one of the major reasons we are to assemble together. In order to receive and to give this encouragement we must be present. So let us be here to encourage and to receive the encouragement we so desperately need.

Everyone is invited to bring finger foods and your warm wishes to the 2024 Graduate's Reception on May 19th after the evening service. We will be




